RIDE DESCRIPTION

On the last day of BikeMaine 2016, we trace the Narraguagus River north to Cherryfield, known as “the wild blueberry capital of the world.” We travel west along the Blackwoods Scenic Byway for a short while before turning left through Unionville. We then travel south to Winter Harbor, where we turn onto the Schoodic Loop Road for the final coastal miles to Schoodic Institute and a farewell luncheon.
