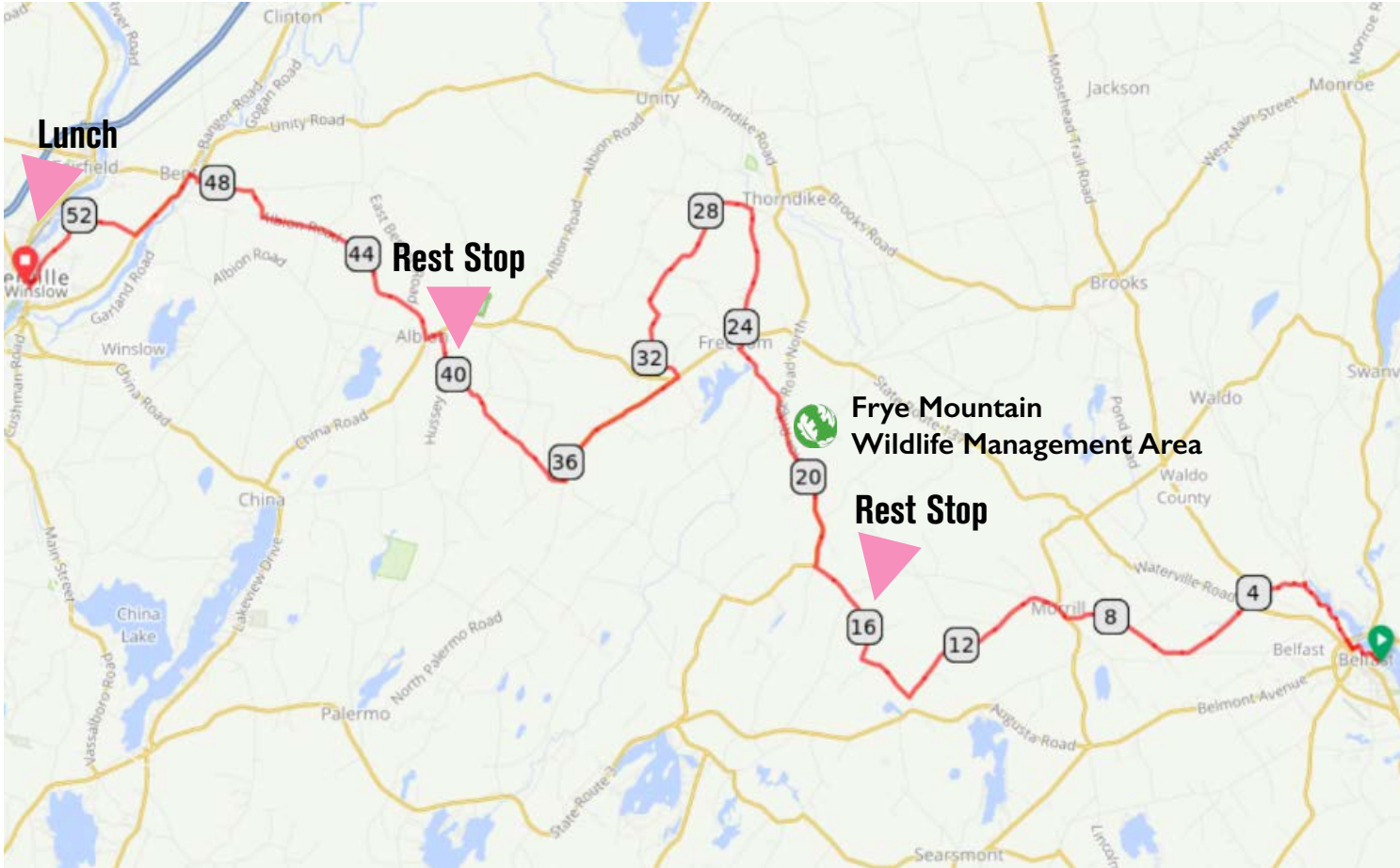


**Route Color:

Frye Mountain Wildlife Management Area

The 5,241-acre Frye Mountain Wildlife Management Area is managed by the Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to support high-quality wildlife habitat. The result is a popular destination for deer and game bird hunters. Hikers can enjoy a section of the Georges Highland Path that provides an opportunity for a 7.4-mile loop hike over 1,139-foot Frye Mountain. The trail follows and crosses beautiful streams, and streams and climbs steadily to a wooded ridge toward the summit.

Route Description

It's hard to believe another year of BikeMaine is in the books! We'll say farewell to Belfast today and head west through Montville to our first rest stop, and learn a thing or two about the area's history from the Montville Historical Society. We'll ride north briefly through the quiet, forested roads towards Freedom, then turn southwest, crossing the Sebasticook River—home to many threatened and endangered species, including the Black Tern and Yellow Lamp Mussel, and a fishing weir that predates the pyramids of ancient Egypt! We'll end up where we started in Waterville, where our finale luncheon awaits.

Points of Interest

Montville Town Hall (16.8) - While grabbing fuel at our first rest stop, step into some history. Members of the Montville Historical Society will have artifacts on display showing early life in the area and will be opening the 1800s Kingdom Schoolhouse next door, as well.

October Fields Apothecary (38.6) - Our second rest stop is at this herbal apothecary, offering handcrafted, organic products made by an environmentally conscious duo. Consider some cold-pressed soap to wash the final day's ride away!
